

## **All Israel's Elect Will Be Saved—Romans 11:25–32**

Topics: Covenant, Disobedience, God, Hardheartedness, Mercy, Salvation, Sin

### **Open It**

1. What would it take to get you to knowingly break an important promise you made?

Romans 11:25–32 (ESV)

<sup>25</sup>Lest you be wise in your own sight, I do not want you to be unaware of this mystery, brothers: a partial hardening has come upon Israel, until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in.

<sup>26</sup>And in this way all Israel will be saved, as it is written, “The Deliverer will come from Zion, he will banish ungodliness from Jacob”;

<sup>27</sup>“and this will be my covenant with them when I take away their sins.”

<sup>28</sup>As regards the gospel, they are enemies for your sake. But as regards election, they are beloved for the sake of their forefathers.

<sup>29</sup>For the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable.

<sup>30</sup>For just as you were at one time disobedient to God but now have received mercy because of their disobedience,

<sup>31</sup>so they too have now been disobedient in order that by the mercy shown to you they also may now receive mercy.

<sup>32</sup>For God has consigned all to disobedience, that he may have mercy on all.
